

## Who is responsible for cleaning up dog faeces?

Primarily dog walkers are responsible for cleaning up after their pets, and it is a punishable offence if they don't.

Local Authorities have a duty under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005 to keep highways and public land

clear of dog faeces. Public land can include: parks, children's play grounds, sports grounds, beaches, pavements, verges and footpaths.


