



#### **Top Crime Categories**

For October/November 25 Rogiet, as you can see Violence without injury is top of the list again.







As you can see from the chart the incident types which have been reported in the last 28 days.

Violence without injury is categorised as assault without injury, harassment, stalking without violence are a few of the offences within this category. There are two offences which have been recorded neither of these are repeat incidents.

All other thefts is two recorded offences one make off without payment and the other is a parcel which was delivered with its contents missing. The public order incident is a road rage type incident with gesturing there is no complaint from the victim.

Criminal damage is damage which has been caused to property this investigation is ongoing.

There is an incident in which was reported to Gwent Police at approximately 6pm on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2025. This incident resulted in a large emergency services response to an address in Crossways, Rogiet following a report of a dog attack. A 9 month old baby boy was pronounced dead at the scene. The dog involved was an XL Bully type dog which was registered with DEFRA. Two persons have been arrested and bailed whilst enquiries are ongoing.

Since the incident we have increased patrols and to try to reassure the community as much as possible. We understand that there maybe some community concerns around this incident but would urge people not to speculate as this is an ongoing investigation.

Since the incident there has been some ASB in the surrounding area of the incident but after review there is no link, its youths kicking doors and posting it on social media and we in the process of identifying them and will deal with them accordingly.

We will continue to engage with the community through patrols and surgeries during this difficult time.
